

Creative Ways in Which Teachers have Used the Operation Water Drop and Operation Water Pollution Programs

- Several teachers have used the high school Operation Water Drop kit with gifted middle years students in order to challenge their students.
- Many teachers of the younger elementary grades (for example, grade 2) have used our kits and have invited older students who had already used the kits in their classrooms or the students' parents or extra paraprofessionals to visit their classroom to help their students to perform the experiments.
- Teachers have used our Operation Water Drop and Operation Water Pollution kits on field trips, for example on canoe trips to test water from streams, lakes and rivers.
- Numerous teachers have used our Operation Water Drop and Operation Water Pollution kits with environmental clubs at their school and then had the students in the environmental clubs present what they have discovered to their fellow students and/or their fellow community members.
- Some students have used the Operation Water Drop kits for their science fair projects.
- Many teachers use the Operation Water Drop kits to show their students that the tap water is safe in their community and that they should stop buying bottled water.
- While many teachers split their students up into groups to perform the tests contained in the Operation Water Drop kit simultaneously, several other teachers have all of their students demonstrate their tests to the rest of the class.
