I have actually worked on some of the reservations across Saskatchewan, I am aware of this situation and find it unacceptable.

The right to safe drinking water in my opinion is a basic human right, that needs to be acknowledged.

I would ask that you take a look at our platform about holding federal government accountable for their portion or the monies owed to First Nations Persons in Saskatchewan.

I think that we need to make every effort to rectify this situation as quickly as possible with a long term solution, not a band aid solution. I would most certainly hope that all Government officials make this a top priority and would encourage them to do so.
