World Rivers Day Webinar and Saskatoon Event

World Rivers Day always takes place the fourth Sunday in September. It is a celebration of the world's waterways. It highlights the value of rivers, strives to increase public awareness, and encourages the improved stewardship of all rivers around the world. Rivers face a large number of threats and we need to ensure their health. It began in British Columbia, Canada, as BC Rivers Day, in 1980. Mark Angelo is an internationally celebrated river conservationist and he started BC Rivers Day and proposed a World Rivers Day Event. The United Nations saw the event as a good fit for the aims of the Water for Life Decade and approved the proposal. The first World Rivers Day took place in 2005; it was a great success and was celebrated across dozens of countries.

SDWF participated in two events for World Rivers Day 2019.

We held a webinar on Friday, September 20 for Streamable Learning/Live Learning Canada. If you are an educator who receives our email messages, you had the opportunity to be one of our guests at this webinar. The webinar was about what World Rivers Day is, what we know about Canadian rivers, what we know about American rivers, and how rivers are related to our drinking water.

We also had a booth at the Saskatoon Farmers' Market for the World Rivers Day event in Saskatoon that we organized with Meewasin, South Saskatchewan River Watershed Stewards, and Partners FOR the Saskatchewan River Basin – Celebrate Our River! Approximately 500 people visited our booth and learned about our organization, the educational programs we offer, and had the opportunity to do some hands-on water testing.

Pike Lake School won the Student Action on Saskatchewan Water Attitudes Competition that we held last school year. We were invited to their Community Barbecue that took place on Thursday, September 26. We were able to see the unveiling of their water bottle cap art project and present them with their plaque.

We learned that the water bottle filling station is already proving to be a very exciting and useful addition to their school!





Compete in the Fall 2019 Student Action on Canadian Water Attitudes Competition!


Thanks to funding from The W. Garfield Weston Foundation and RBC, we are holding a Fall 2019 Student Action on Canadian Water Attitudes Competition.

This competition is open to all students, in kindergarten to grade 12, in Canada. Students will investigate water issues in their community/area. The competition will involve students surveying their community to get an understanding of knowledge and attitudes on a topic of their choice and presenting their findings in a report. The grand prize will be for the top school in Canada. It is valued at \$3,000 and includes a water bottle filling station, a commemorative plaque, and possibly some reusable water bottles and/or water testing kits! There will also be a prize package for the top school in Saskatchewan. It is valued at \$2,200 and includes a water bottle filling station and a commemorative plaque. (Note: If the top school in Canada is located in Saskatchewan then the second place school in Saskatchewan will win the prize package valued at \$2,200.)

We will hold webinars that will explain every step of the project. We will be there to support the teachers and their students every step of the way! We will always be available to answer questions, help with tech issues, or just to discuss ideas!

By joining us in changing attitudes on water issues facing Canadian residents, your students not only will have a chance to win an amazing water themed prize package but will also be proactive in positive change in their community and environment!

Purchase Kits to Be Guaranteed to Have Valuable Hands-on Resources to Use with Your Students!

The beginning of the school year is a wonderful time to use relevant, authentic, hands-on materials with your students to motivate them!

An Operation Water Pollution kit costs \$170 and is guaranteed to be reusable for at least two years — so all of the students in your school can use it! Each Elementary Operation Water Drop kit, High School Operation Water Drop kit, or Operation Water Biology kit can be used with a classroom of approximately 30 eager learners! Each Elementary Operation Water Drop kit costs \$85 (total, shipping & handling included!), and each High School Operation Water Drop kit or Operation Water Biology kit costs \$170 (again, shipping & handling included!).

State of Drinking Water Quality in Canada

According to Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (www.sac-isc.gc.ca/eng/1506514143353/1533317130660) as of September 3, 2019 there were 56 long-term (meaning the advisory has been in place for more than a year) drinking water advisories in effect in First Nations communities. In addition, according to Health Canada (https://www.sac-isc.gc.ca/eng/1562856509704/1562856530304) as of October 2, 2019, there were 47 short-term Drinking Water Advisories in place in First Nations communities. These numbers include public water systems financially supported by Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) but not systems in British Columbia and within the Saskatoon Tribal Council.

In total, across Canada, according to watertoday.ca (www.watertoday.ca) as of October 3, 2019 there were 879 Boil Water Advisories and 43 Do Not Consume Orders.

The goal of SDWT is safe drinking water from every tap. The team members are First Nations water treatment operators and scientific advisors who help First Nations water treatment operators and rural water treatment operators with their water treatment challenges. SDWT also promotes the best available technology for water treatment and advocates for stricter guidelines and regulations for drinking water.



Please submit your students' Operation Water Drop (OWD) test results! Not only will you be involving your students in citizen science, but you will also receive a token of our appreciation! If you have used one or more OWD kits with your students, please go to <u>testresults.safewater.org</u> in order to enter their results. If you have lost your code(s) click on the Lost your code? link, enter your email address, and your code(s) will be emailed to you.

If you received a sponsored kit thanks to Lush, then you agreed to submit your students' OWD results after having used the kit; this was a condition of receiving a sponsored kit through this funding.
